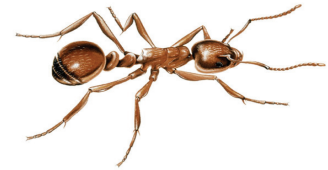
All GRRC members PLEASE remember how much work we have put into being good neighbors. The board has received many calls about **GRRC traffic driving at high speeds on the gravel road to the range**. With this year being extremely warm and dry the dust problem is worse than ever. If you drive the last couple of miles at 35 mph it will only take 2-3 minutes longer to get to the range. This request is a very serious matter and members who ignore this request will be held accountable for the choices that they make.

Change in the All Around shotgun rules: To make it easier for members to get their round of trap in, we are now going to use the battery-operated trap instead of the trap house. I have placed white markers in front of the trap stations to shoot from, five birds from each station. Set the trap to the wobble position. Once you start to shoot for score, the next 25 birds count. No practice birds, no mulligans for misfires, no redos for forgetting to take the safety off, etc. You will need to bring a 50 ft extension cord with you to get the foot switch back far enough. It will be easier if you have a second person to pull and score for you- but not necessary. If you have any questions feel free to call me. There is plenty of time to still buy targets and shoot them before the end of the year. **Rich Williams** 763-546-0313

GRRC GMM Meeting 7/17/12

President Dave Newell called the meeting to order at 7:20pm, on 17 July 2012 the Red Shed, Harris, MN. A 52-member quorum was not present, with 44 members and 2 guests attending.

Vice-President Kim Frick led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed to honor departed companions and those serving in the military.

The minutes from the May and June 2012 GMM have been published in the Gazette. A motion to accept the minutes to be deferred until the next GMM was made and accepted.

Executive Officer's Report Bruce Aune noted that there are members who are entering the range when the front gate is locked and not signing in at the mailbox. Also, a vehicle has been seen speeding on the range roads. Members - show your membership card, then address the person(s) in question for their GRRC membership card, and then discuss the Range Rule infraction. If possible, write down the vehicle license number. Remember, members have the right to ask for a GRRC membership card and question any suspected of a violation. Then contact the XO.

Chief Instructor's Report – No report.

1st Readings – None

2nd Readings - Reid Golden and Dave Andrianes were both present.

Sergeant at Arms Kurt Nelson led the applicants, guests and non-members from the room. Treasurer Rich Williams gave an abbreviated report. Acceptance of same will be deferred until the August GMM. The new members, and guests were brought back into the room.

2nd Readings were asked to see the Secretary after the meeting to pay their Initiation Fees and encouraged to come to future GRRC meetings and events.

Committee Reports: (Committees not listed had no report).
Action Arms, Steven Shimek: On 15 July, 13 shooters participated in a "Sniper Match" which was dominated by the latest in technology with gas guns, ie, at 800yds 9 rounds produced 9 9's; at 200yds with 1 minute dots, 6 shots equaled 60 pts in the dot in 45 seconds.

All Around Match: Rich reported that the All Around Match on 6/30 did not see many shooters as it was so hot. The shotgun rules have changed to using the battery operated thrower. Everyone is still 'on your honor' for scoring. No mulligans on second 25 birds.

Black Powder: Goose Creek Rendezvous is 9/14-16. This event is set in the 1860-70's fur trading period. Come out on Saturday for a walkabout to see people dressed in period clothes. MNLRA match last weekend had 33 competitors with a 13yr. old taking third overall.

BP Cartridge: Come out for some great fun the weekend of July 28-29 for the .22 rimfire match. Bring any .22 cal to compete.

Campgrounds: Steve Marden – watch the GRRC website for news.

High Power: 'M1 for Vets' shoot was last weekend with 14 shooters. All proceeds will be used to purchase M1's for the Vets. Donations received from members at tonight's meeting was \$442. This event will most likely be GRRC sponsored in 2013. With the experience from this year, the 2013 shoot will be more efficient and better advertised.

Minutes, con't.

Juniors: Reservations filled early for Camp Perry, so the Juniors did not attend this year.

Legislative: Steve Marden said there is lot of information on the GRRC website. Sending your letters, cards, e-mails to your congressional representative are appropriate in requesting their defeat of current legislation. Check the GRRC website for details.

Membership: Due to an error in counting, there are 20 on the Waiting List. This number does not include the new applicants – not yet voted on – **due to second straight non-quorum presence.**

Newsletter: Dave is still pitching the e-version. We are two members away from 50% participation.

Pistol: IPSC is in its 9 week out of 10 weeks for the 2012 season. There will be a shoot-off and picnic on July 30th. Remember firing .223 center fire is not allowed on the Pistol Range.

Shotgun: Larry said there is an open invitation to come out on Wednesday evenings at 5 p.m. Reminder that those using the battery operated thrower have to be sure to check that it has not been left in the cocked position. He will put an information sheet by the thrower with details.

Website: Dave reported that the website is up and running. It is getting more hits each week and is instrumental in bringing in new shooters to GRRC and an increase in general public interest.

Women's Camp: Joyce said there were 19 shooters at this year's event, which netted a \$135 profit. She thanked everyone for their help; is looking forward to another successful year in 2012.

Good & Welfare/Correspondence: A Thank You was received from Dallas Leier who was recently hospitalized for back surgery. Bill Prock will be having hip replacement on July 30.

OLD BUSINESS

Tractor update: Still looking for a good used tractor. Followed one lead, but it was not the type GRRC wanted.

Archery Chair: President asked for a new chair for this discipline. Please contact Dave with your interest.

Ransom Rest: Steve Shimek said the missing Ransom Rest belongs to a GRRC member, who has taken it home. To have this item readily available it should be budgeted for 2013.

NEW BUSINESS

Range Signage: Although NAT, suggestions were bantered about securing more signage indicating the various usages of each range. Flags seem to be favored.

Suggestions were offered about availability of wooden pallets for temporary walkways for weed control over the swamp area. It is noted that the swamp is chest-deep in some areas; and, that weed control is best accomplished when the swamp has frozen. B & N Sheetmetal, Wyoming has a large stockpile of free pallets in all sizes.

Attention to NRA Memberships Needed

In the last issue of Gazette, a short comment was printed in the Red Shed Report about **checking on the status of your NRA membership.** Detailed examination of the membership roster reveals that there are three members whose NRA membership expired in 2010 or 2011 and need to get their membership renewed ASAP and they are # 101, 1304 and 1312. Additionally, there are 133 members that will have their NRA memberships expire sometime during 2012. To find out if your NRA membership is due for renewal, look at your NRA magazine mailing label or your NRA membership card for the expiration date.

When renewing, PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE do not renew at a gun show. From experience, this method creates nothing but problems for our members and our Secretary. If you choose to use that way to renew, it will take up to six months for the NRA rep to turn in your renewal form. No amount of calling to the NRA national membership office will speed up your renewal. The very best bet is to have your credit card ready to 1- Call the NRA membership office to renew, or 2 – do the renewal via the NRA website.

Final word on your NRA membership. When the October issue of the Gazette arrives in the mail, be sure to attach a copy of your new NRA membership card or the mailing label of your NRA magazine in the box on the upper right corner of the GRRC membership renewal form.

MN State Long Range Championship

Warm weather and humidity plagued the Minn St. Long Range Championships, this past weekend, but 20 Sling shooters and 11 F-class competitors shrugged off the conditions and fired mostly 10s and Xs at GRRC's long range shooting facility near Harris MN. Saturday's competition was all about the 1000 yd line. Shooters would fire from almost 5/8th of a mile onto targets 6 ft square. They would fire from prone, off their elbows, with iron sights! While a 6ft square target may seem a generous size to shoot at, even from that amazing distance, is really isn't. The black dot on the target is only 44 inches in diameter, and if you only hit near the edge of it, you only score 8 pts. In order to score a 10, you have to hit the 10 ring only 22 inch wide or even the 10 in wide X ring. That's right --- in order to win this 1000 yd State Championship, you must be able to shoot, unsupported, with iron sights almost every shot into a 20 in circle at 5/8th of a mile--all the while knowing that a un-noticed change in the wind of even 1mph, can change the strike of the bullet by 10 inches on the target. In this match skill is worth a lot more than luck.



The 31 shooters gathered at GRRC were the best in the upper Midwest and they would prove it today. On the F-class side of the line it was Adam Shidla that dominated through-out the day by winning each of the three 20 shot contests with scores of 198, 197, and 195 on F-class targets, where the 10 ring shrinks to only 10 inches or 1 moa., and the X ring is only half of that. That was amazing shooting, and it should be noted that Adam put 27 of the 60 shots in the 5 inch X ring! E. Johnson, and Rick Sievers took 2nd and 3rd, only 4 pts back with 586 scores. On the Iron Sight end of the line, it was also a tight battle right from the start. In the first match Steve McGee, Bill Lair, and Brian Mrnak each dropped only one pt. for 199 scores, and Brian's 14 Xs breaking the tie for the win. In the 2nd match only Steve McGee was able to shoot a clean target for the win. Shirley McGee gets a 2nd on a creedmore tie breaker over Bill Lair. Master Class shooter, Erik Rhode is just back one point, after shooting a 197. Steve M. fired another clean 200 score in the last match, and posted the highest score for the day after dropping only one pt in the 60 shots for record -- 599-35x. Highest scoring Minnesota resident and 1000 yd Champ is Capt. Bob Peasley - 591-23x.

On Sunday, the shooters switched to their .308 caliber match rifles to contest the State Palma Championship. Three matches of 15 shots, were on tap today. The shooters would fire one match at each of the 3 yard lines starting at 800 yds, then moving to the 900 yd line and finally shooting the last match back at the now familiar 1000 yd line.

I was going to shoot today--give it a try. I haven't shot any long range for about 8 years, but the Palma match starts at the 800yd line and I figured that I could get a good score there at least. I also didn't have the .308 cal rifle required, so I would be shooting "out of competition" (score doesn't count). I had good 600yd zeros, so I just added 8 min of angle to the sights and was pretty sure that I would hit the target. I was 2nd relay, so I studied the wind while Chuck D. shot, and when it was my turn, I added a 1/2 min right on the sight and fired the first sighter. the target went down and came up a scratch 8 at 7'oclock -- so far so good. Since I had called a good shot, I put on a full correction for the 2nd sighter and it went out the top. Two more sighters close together in the top of the 10 ring so dropped the sights a 1/2 min and went for record. The first 3 record shots stayed high in 10 ring and then 2 more clicks down brought 9 Xs and 3 more 10s for a 150 score. Well, well, well, that was fun ! My day was a success already.

Five other shooters also cleaned their targets that first match, with Brian Mrnak getting the win with 13 tie breaking Xs. Back at the 900 yd line, I would shoot first before going to the pits to pull targets for a while. I dropped the front sight one notch to make up the 6 moa I would have to add to the sights a the longer distance. At my sight radius, of 35 inches, it takes about 5 clicks per moa. This time we got only two sighters, and my first was a high nine so I came down 4 clicks and got another high nine so I dropped another 4 clicks for the 1st record shot. Arrrrg, a nine out the top, then one just out at 10. So two shots and two pts down. At the end of the 15 shots I had lost another pt. to a slight breeze and had shot a bad shot into the 8 ring. So 145 was the score and I was glad to get that. It was hot and I felt roasted. W. Davis, S. McGee, and Stacey Tamulinas all fired clean 150s at the 900 yd line, with Stacey getting the with with the highest X count. Back at the 1000 yd line, I decided I was a little too over heated and so I would just watch. I had had a good day, so why push it. Stacey T. and Steve M. fought it out for the day's win in this last match but neither was able clinch the victory with a clean target. Steve only shot one nine (all day long) and finished with the days high score - 449-26x. Phil Klanderud, who shot clean at the 800 yd line and lost only 2pts at the 900 yd. line is the Minnesota State Palma Champ, after shooting an awesome 444-20x for the day. The Over all Minnesota Long Range champ is Capt. Bob Peasley whose top score was 1031-36x.

Note: From Capt Bob:

Steve McGee's 200-14x with irons at 1000 was an Any Rifle,non Res. record -- As was his 449-26x Palma Score. I will be sending him a non resident certificates.

On the F-class side of the firing line, the competition was just as fierce. E. Johnson won the Palma match with an awesome score of 444- 22x, and that score added to his Saturday 1000 yd score also earned him the over all F-class Long Range Championship. 2nd in the Palma match with the same score of 444, but a few less Xs, was J. Rykhus. 2nd in the Overall championship was A. Shidla, with a combined total score of 1015-37x.

M1 for Vets/CMP Games 7/14 at GRRRC

I just knew it would be a “fun” match - and it was. On Saturday, 7/14 I headed up to GRRRC bright and early, to participate in the CMP Games Tom Torborg and Kurt Borglaug were putting on. I had heard that they aimed more at having fun than serious competition. This match was also billed as a fund raiser for the “M1 for Vets” program and proceeds were donated to that program. The day started out at the Red Shed with the volunteers cooking a hearty breakfast for all. A short program followed with Flag raising by the VFW color guard and Bruce Peglow playing *Amazing Grace* on the bagpipes.

After open festivities, the shooters moved down to the 200 yd line where most of the matches were shot. This was a Service Rifle match, mostly for obsolete service rifles, but you could shoot in the ‘modern military’ class if you brought a AR-15. Only a couple of us shot ‘modern’ guns, and most of the guys had brought out the M-1s, Enfields, Springfield ‘03s, and there was even a Swiss K31 on the line.

There were enough Gopher volunteers (thank you, thank you) to cover the pits, so the shooters just had to shoot and have fun. The ‘Course of fire’ was pretty much the same as a President’s Match course. We first had time for 5 sighters from the prone position, to get every one on target with the older guns. Then each shooter fired 10 shots Prone Slow fire for record, followed with a 10 string of Prone Rapid fire, and then 10 shots Slow Fire Standing to complete the 30 shots for Record. There were two relays, and both were done after about two hours- time for lunch. That’s right--- lunch break! Once again Jeff Anderson had the barbeque going and there were hamburgers and dogs for everyone! After lunch Tom re-squaded everyone and we did it again --- we shot another 30 shot match in about an hour and a half to finish out that part of the day’s events.

Next up, for those who needed more trigger time, was a two-man team match for vintage sniper rifles. About six teams of two participated in this match, which was shot from the 600 yd line with scoped Springfields and similar rifles. Targets were presented for 20 seconds at a time, with spotters calling the wind and the shooter having get the shot off while the target was in the air. I was amazed at how well some of these older rifles put shots in the middle from that distance.

I had more fun at this match than I have had in a long time. I’ll be back for the next CMP games at Gopher. Besides having some fun, we did raise some money for the M1 for Vets program. Double the pleasure.

President’s Notes: BIG Qs and As

I am making writing headway. Instead of the bulleted list format I’ve favored for several months, I am branching out into the Q/A format.

I get phone calls. An organization with as many members as GRRRC generates a lot of questions. These are some of the important questions that are NOT being asked, but should:

Q. If the gate is open do I have to sign in?

A. The gate is open for people who are going to participate in a scheduled event. If you are going to be participating in that scheduled event you don’t have to sign in. In you are going to another range for non-event shooting you **must sign in**.

Q. What firearms can I shoot at the pistol range?

A. Any 22 rimfire firearm, rifles that shoot straight pistol cartridges, and shotguns for the propose of testing the shotgun pattering. This means NO rifles that shoot bottle neck ammunition.

Q. When at the range, if someone asks to see my membership card and member number do I have to show it to them?

A. Absolutely YES! By refusing to share your member information with another member, you are ignoring one of GRRRC’s most important rules. By refusing to share member information, that member will be severely dealt with.

Q. If I ask someone at the range for proof of membership and they refuse what should I do?

A. Every situation is different. If you feel in danger, walk away and report it a GRRRC board member as soon as possible. The GRRRC range is private property and being a member, you have the right to call 911 and report that there is someone trespassing on range property. When dealing with a stranger with guns never take a chance. Walk away and be safe.

I continue to be frustrated at the non-quorum attendance during the summer months. We have a lot of business to accomplish, and need member wisdom and input to be successful. Please make an effort to be present on General Membership nights- the third Tuesday of the month.

I continue to be grateful to the members who are working so hard within their disciplines, and who take the time to write up their views on them for the Gazette. We have had a number of great shoots at the range, and want to share the results with the membership. Many thanks to Jim Evenson for sharing observations from his website, MN Rifle Shooting.

On the bright side, granddaughter Gracie had such a great time at *Women on Target* in April that she has joined in three different shoots at Gopher in the past month. “Mr. A” found a gun in his arsenal for her to use, and she has learned to shoot it, clean it and make bullets for it. 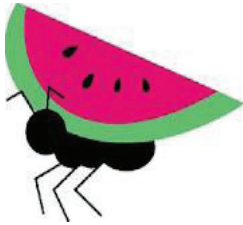
